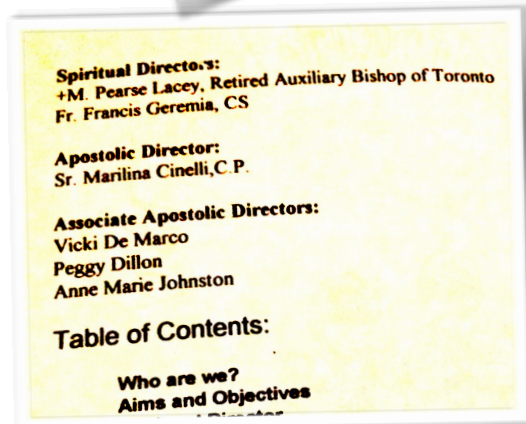
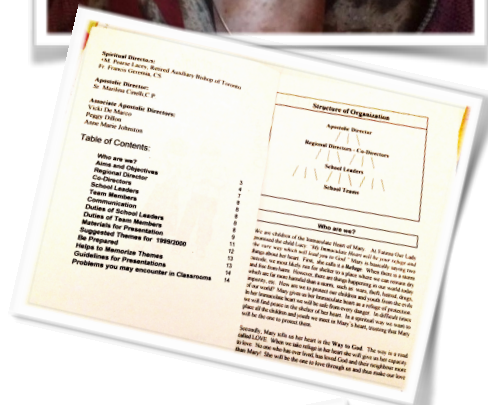
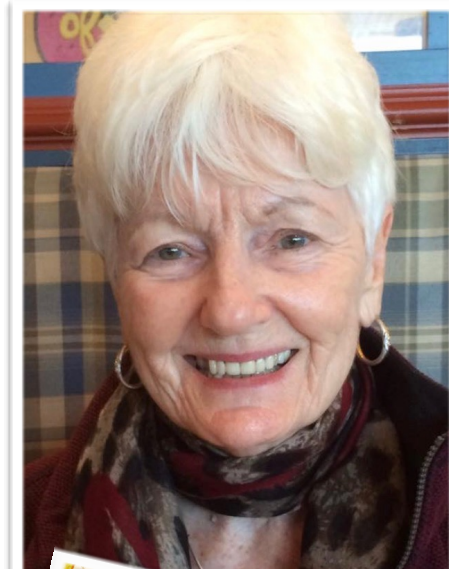
Peggy was an amazing model of virtue, gentleness and the love of the Blessed Virgin Mary for us all. Every School she walked into, she was greatly loved by children and staff alike.

I still remember how she enjoyed visiting most the primary grades. I recall how creative she was, using an Angel doll and Mary doll to explain the First Joyful Mystery, the Annunciation. How she cherished the beautiful thank-you cards and pictures the children would give her at the end of the year. As shown in the picture above. And how attentive the children were to hear soft spoken message of love!

In these first years, Peggy was very instrumental in bringing the Rosary Apostolate into so many schools in the Toronto Catholic District School Boards.

She willingly co-authored our very first Training Booklet which was reviewed and approved by our First Spiritual Director, Bishop M. Pearce Lacey.

Peggy also contributed to writing Themes and Rosary presentations to give to students in the classrooms.
